VISUAL NOTIFICATION SYSTEM (VNS)

is a broad term that refers to technology that can make persons who are culturally deaf, oral deaf, and deafened and hard of hearing aware of the triggering of smoke detectors, carbon monoxide detectors, baby monitors, telephones, doorbells, public announcement systems, text screens and building security systems, typically by incorporating a strong flashing light into the device.
